This issue marks the 28<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our distributing this family newsletter!

As in past years, we are adding the newsletter to our website at www.colehour.com. Our Webmaster, Colin Colehour, has been very busy again this updating The web vear data. site experienced about 19,500 page views in the last twelve months, a little lower than last year.

Our family database is now at number 14,397, an increase of 244 people since the last newsletter and we also added another 107 people to the Kohlhauer database. This increase is below the 2017 level but is stunted by my lack of entering new data gleaned from the website Newspapers.com.

Some people have asked how I became interested in the family history and genealogy. So here goes. Around 1983 I received a telephone call at my Miami residence. We are Minnesota natives and did not know anyone in Florida so it was surprising to hear the person say he was Chuck Colehour and he was calling from the airport as he was passing through and found my name in the phone book, something I did as well when I was traveling. He said he was from Rockford, IL. I remembered that I had a bare bones summary of the family history received from my uncle Robert W. Colehour. From that I figured out that we were third cousins, sharing a descent from Henry Colehower that moved to Mount Carroll, IL in 1855. My curiosity was piqued and my wife suggested I needed a new hobby. What an understatement!

So I purchased a minimal genealogy software package and started recording my limited information. I began going to the library and looked through their extensive collection of national phone books to collect names and addresses. They also had many old city directories that were helpful. I began writing letters to everyone I could find. Many people I contacted said that they had previously heard from my uncle Robert, so I definitely was not the first to do this. I hired a person in Germany to copy Kohlhauer names and addresses over there. Eventually I collected so much data that I felt it was time to share it in a family newsletter. My first issue came out in 1991 and I was asking for an \$8 subscription fee. Of course this was pre Internet and email and I was just learning how to use a computer so I enlisted

help from co-workers and my wife. I continued with quarterly newsletters for four years until it became too much. From year five to the present I have been sending out one free newsletter per year. In 1996 we took a tour to Germany and met a few of the Kohlhauers there. We were not the first to do this as Richard O. Colehour of Mount Carroll, IL was there the previous year.

Researching was challenging but exciting to me. As we got into the technology age it became easier. I also researched my entire family tree and then did my wife's. My children got real tired of tromping through cemeteries and siting in libraries. I went from knowing only one great-grandparent to tracing all the way back to the Pilgrims and then some. It has been a fun journey and will ultimately result in a huge genealogy book.

# Around the Nation

DNA testing has become the fashionable thing to do in genealogy research. My wife and I, our two children and three grandchildren, my brother, his son and six first cousins have all taken the test through Ancestry.com. Results are very interesting and are improved as more people are tested. I now show matches to 724 fourth cousins or closer compared with 403 last year at this time. A feature relatively new is called DNA Circles where people with shared DNA are centered around a common ancestor. One example is that the immigrant John Kohlhauer now shows twenty people that share descent from him. The number of matches is understated because some people have not completed a pedigree chart online so matching can not be verified.

Matt and Maegen Colehour of Cheshire, CT have opened up a language school in their city called Small World Language that is focused on providing early foreign language to children of all ages. Some of the benefits of these classes are: enhanced cultural understanding, communication skills, problem solving, academic achievement and ease of learning additional languages.

We have read that **Sam Colehower** is a pitcher for the University of Northern Colorado baseball team. He graduated from Cherry Hills High School at Englewood, CO and is the son of **Kurt** and **Juanita Colehower**.

In the 2017 issue we wrote about receiving an email from a descendant of another,

unknown to us, Kohlhauer immigrant to the US. After researching this line we can confirm that the immigrant is indeed a Kohlhauer. We will explore her family lines below.

Katherine A. Kohlhauer was born October, 1874 at Braunfels, Germany. She was the daughter of Phillip Konrad and Katharina (Schuetz) Kohlhauer. She had siblings named Emma, Heinrich and Marie, two of which left descendants and thus cousins in Germany. Katherine arrived in the US in 1895 and thirteen days after arrival was married to Gustave Maag at Indianapolis, IN, who himself had arrived in the US in 1894 from Switzerland. She died May 27, 1940 at Bend, OR. Her husband died in 1942. They had four children, surname Maag: Theophile G., Deborah Angeline, Paul Wesley, and Hulda K.
